"How then are they to call on Him in whom they have not believed? How are they to believe in Him whom they have not heard? And how are they to hear without a preacher? But how are they to preach unless they are sent? Just as it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news of good things!""

ROMANS 10:14-15

I grew up going to church. When we lived in Willow Street, we attended the United Church of Christ with my mother. When my parents separated, we started attending the First Assembly of God in Columbia. Often times after church, we returned to my grandparent's or dad's house and have Sunday dinner. After dinner, I'd listen to stories from my grandfather in the unfinished basement or living room: on growing up, on death, on marriage, or lessons he gleaned in life through observance and experience. I listened to some of the same stories over and over and over again: not appreciated at the time, but thought of fondly now. We did this almost every Sunday. Week after week, month after month, year after year.

I started attending Millersville University after graduating high school. Even then, I typically attended the Assembly and returned to dad's for dinner. One Sunday stands out to me as being different: after 7 years of attending this church, an older couple in the body invited me to their house for Sunday dinner and to learn more about me and my walk. They lived in a


modest house. I remember it being dimmer inside than most houses I've been in. I remember the food being slightly different...good, just different than my normal Sunday dinner. Other than sharing a meal after being baptized at a brother's house, that's the only family that invited me into their home.

Sharing stories of life and faith. growing up and learning lessons, passing on wisdom and laughing in foolishness happen most naturally around a table in our homes. The safe guards we put in place can ease as we eat, listen, pray, and share life with one another. It takes a little time, a little planning, and a little patience, but can strengthen the community of believers and allow us to grow – both with one another and people who may not be connected to a community of Christ. The feet of those who bring good news of good things may share their stories of faith and deliverance (i.e. testimony) in homes around a table. This simple step can help us fulfill the call God placed on this body. Who will you invite to dinner?

The kind of community we aim to be...Jesus following, one another focused, loving God, neighbor, enemy, and self with the love we received in Christ, inviting others into the fold, proclaiming the excellencies of the One who called us out of dark and into His marvelous light.

Please know 3 things from the bottom of my heart: first, I am thankful for Hempfield and the chance you gave me to be a part of your journey in serving Christ. It has been a humbling experience, and has affirmed in me that God is still equipping those He calls. Second, I am praying for you! Hempfield has a great trajectory ahead of you, and as long as you listen to the voice of the Good Shepherd, you will not go astray. Which leads me to my third thing: God has, and will, bring exactly who He wants and who you need to this body. You have incredible spiritual leaders here, and I know Doug, Geoff, Laura, and Emmy will continue to do what they do best: modeling Christ in all they do. He is not done with Hempfield. He will bring what He started to completion, because He is true to His word.

So, for one last time, to everyone at Hempfield.

<u>VIDEO UPGRADE FUNDRAISER</u>: We are kicking off a fundraiser to upgrade our

church's video technology for live streaming and recording. With unanimous Leadership Team support, the congregation voted to approve the video upgrade at the April 24 Congregational Gathering.


The total cost of the project is estimated at \$20,000; \$10,000 will come from the Building Fund and \$10,000 will come from this special fundraiser. There is a possibility to receive a grant of up to \$5,000 from the Atlantic Northeast District's Facilities Assistance Fund, therefore we may only need to raise \$5,000. The application for ANE funds was sent on May 25 and we'll keep you informed of its status.








Gather with other believers as we study together.....
