

## That Christ be Lifted Up!

"Now judgment is upon this world; now the ruler of this world will be cast out. *And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to Myself.*" Jesus

John 12:31-32

In our 5 Elements of Relational Healing group, Pastor Robert from Shiloh Missionary Baptist in Norriston often quotes the above in red.

"If Christ is lifted up, He will draw all men unto Himself." Read this verse above three times, ten times, twenty-five times until it's planted deep in

the core of your being. *And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to Myself.* Jesus spoke these words after being anointed by Mary and entering Jerusalem, after crowds of Greeks sought Him out and they heard a voice from heaven. We now know that He was speaking of His death and how He would be crucified.

What does that mean for us today though? How

can Jesus be lifted, or, how can we lift Jesus that all men, all people may be drawn to Him?

### Jesus Lifted in our Speech

When we speak, do we make Christ known? His teachings, His way, His healings, and encounters with people in Scripture and around us? Do we testify to what He's doing in our lives right now? I'm seeing Him move in and around the body as new people darken our doors, as our members share about His movement in their lives, as people outside the body call to acknowledge the presence of the Holy Spirit working through us and into the community. When we lift Christ in our speech, we put everything else – worries, anxieties, politics, cultural topics, family tensions – everything second. This does not mean we do not get into difficult or

hard conversations. It does mean that those conversations are first and foremost informed by Christ.

### Jesus Lifted in our Being

Before Christ is lifted in our speech, He needs to be lifted in our being. If Christ humbled

Himself to enter into the World He created and we live, then we also must humble ourselves to enter into His presence and the presence of those around us. Our posture informed by humility, truth, grace, love, peace, gentleness, and self-control impacts those around us and allows us to grow into His character; i.e., become 'little Christs.'

We do not replace Jesus as Savior, rather, we reflect His

being. As sunburn reflects us being out in the sun (come on summertime!), so His glory reflects off those in spend time with the Son!

### Jesus Lifted in our Actions

Words or no words, when Christ is lifted in our being, He will be lifted in our actions. The way we approach others, the way we treat our family, friends, neighbors, enemies – He can be lifted in our actions. When all else in this world becomes confusing, divisive, arrogant, power-driven, Christ's serves acts to bring truth, humility, grace, and a convicted-meekness because the glory is not ours, but His!

Today, let us lift Christ in our speech, being, and actions that all people may be drawn unto Him!

The kind of community we aim to be...**Jesus following, one another focused, loving** God, neighbor, enemy, and self with the love we received in Christ, **inviting** others into the fold, **proclaiming** the excellencies of the One who called us out of dark and into His marvelous light.

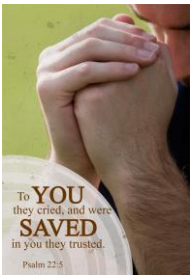
## **Blessed is He Who Comes In the Name of the Lord**

The account of Palm Sunday, or Jesus entering Jerusalem at the beginning of the last week of his life, is one of the few accounts found in all four Gospels. 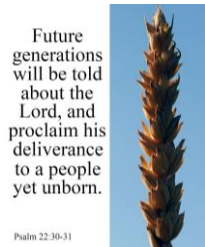
## **Committed to the End**

## **WHFM?**

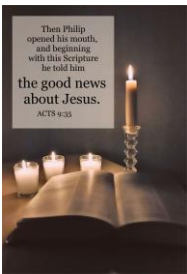
Proverbs 16:1-9; Luke 12:15-21

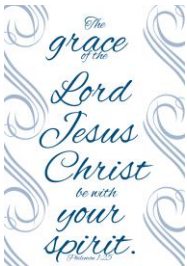
## **Results of Commitment: Philip, Samaria, & The Ethiopian**

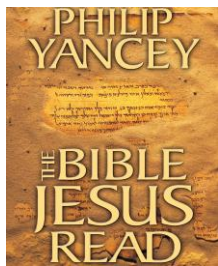

### **2023** The Bible Jesus Read by Philip Yancey

In *The Bible Jesus Read*, award-winning author Philip Yancey combines scholarship and insight to bring new light to old material and stimulates new thought and further study. This eight-session video Bible study uses video and group discussion to explore the sometimes shocking and cryptic writings of the Old Testament to help readers know God better. At the end of the day, God is less concerned with what we do for Him than who we are in Him. Few figures illustrate that truth better than Jonah. Focused on the prophet rather than his prophecy, the story of Jonah gives us a picture of a man on the run due to his own selfish desires. Instead of showing mercy to his enemies, he determined to keep God's grace to himself rather than share it with those he considered undeserving. Can you relate?

Over the course of 8 verse-by-verse sessions, pastor and author Eric Mason expands our vision to see that Jonah's story is our own. Far more than a thrilling Sunday school adventure, it offers a profound glimpse into the conflict that occurs when God calls resistant believers to His mission. More importantly, it underscores the depths of His compassion not only in redeeming the lost, but redeeming those He has called to participate in His reconciling work.

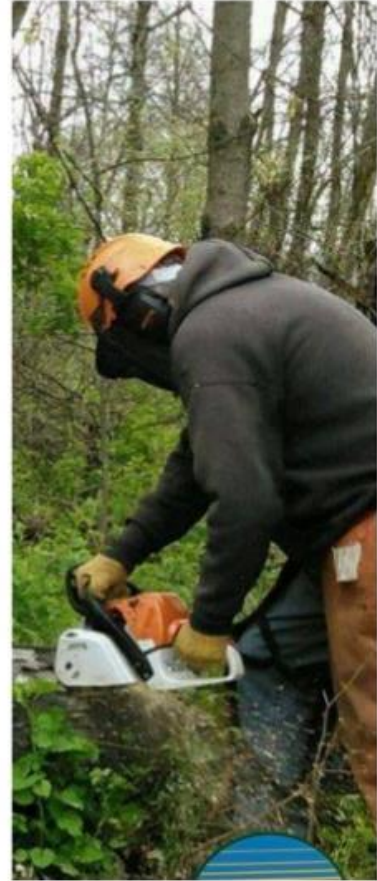

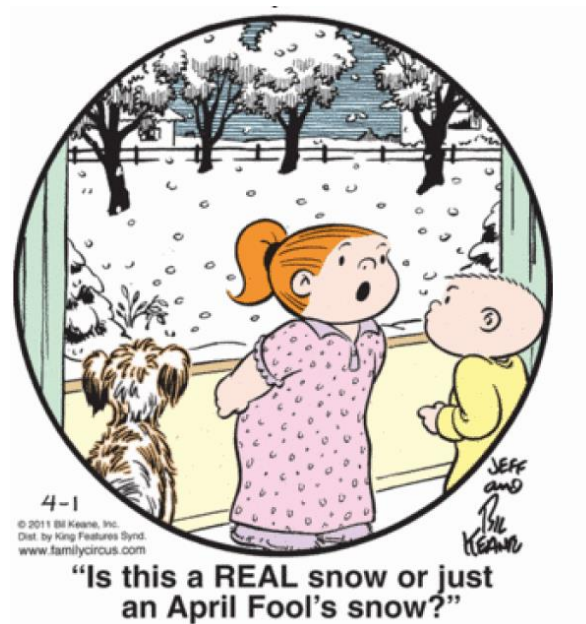
