"But there were some of them, men of Cyprus and Cyrene, who came to Antioch and began speaking to the Greeks also, preaching the Lord Jesus. And the hand of the Lord was with them, and a large number who believed turned to the Lord. The news about them reached the ears of the church at Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas off to Antioch. Then when he arrived and witnessed the grace of God, he rejoiced and began to encourage them all

When we think of church, or the church, our mind often turns to structures: meeting houses or ornate buildings, warehouse conference centers, steeples and crosses, stained glass and wooden pews. Some churches are known by their name or the personality that leads them, some by the flags

they fly, or the symbols they display. Some of these are informed by faith; some informed by politics or ideologies. How will the 21st Century American Church be remembered? How will they be defined in history? How will we at Hempfield be known?

If we consider this passage from Acts 11, we can see the core of our vision: they were preaching (or proclaiming) the Lord

Jesus Christ, a number of them believed and joined the fold, Barnabas focused on the bod – both rejoicing with it and encouraging it to remain true in the Lord. Because of their faithful actions and God's faithful presence, their relationships, status, and labels began to change. When people in the

with resolute heart to remain *true* to the Lord; for he was a good man, and full of the Holy Spirit and of faith.

And considerable numbers were brought to the Lord. And he left for Tarsus to look for Saul; and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. And for an entire year they met with the church and taught considerable numbers; and the disciples were first called **Christians** in Antioch.

ACTS 11.20-26

surrounding area saw this group of followers, this group of believers, they were reminded of Jesus Christ...and gave this group the name of *Christian*. A now transformed people, this church, were known by the One they followed because they began to do the things that He did. They didn't have

big, set apart buildings to gather in, no budgets, no head quarters. *They were* the church and where they walked, lived, resided, the presence of God was with them.

Our brothers and sisters at Friendship Community sing a song, "I am the church! You are the church! We are the church together!" This song reminds us who we are – that our very being in this world,

filled with the Holy Spirit, is where the church resides. May we be like the early church: following Jesus, loving as we have been loved, proclaiming Christ to all, and focused on meeting one another's needs. In this way, others may see and say, "I believe they are a Christian."

The kind of community we aim to be...Jesus following, one another focused, loving God, neighbor, enemy, and self with the love we received in Christ, inviting others into the fold, proclaiming the excellencies of the One who called us out of dark and into His marvelous light.



HCOB Children's Ministry Happenings

As you might guess, an event like the Easter Egg Hunt involves many people in a variety of ways. After our church celebration meal on March 26, about 40 individuals helped stuff eggs for the egg hunt. While it seems like it would take quite some time to stuff 2500 eggs, many hands truly did make the work light. Our helpers made fast work of stuffing eggs.

The egg hunt itself was held on April 1. While rain forced the event indoors, it was truly a successful morning! 66 children and 85 adults attended. Guests were able to make their selections for the basket raffle (created by our wonderful ministry teams!) and then met in the sanctuary where we looped videos from VBS and Harvest Fest last year. We began with a story, gave themed baskets to the winners, and then directed our egg hunters to their designated areas. Afterwards, each child was able to choose a prize from our prize table as well as a treat back with crafts, snacks, and a Bible verse to commemorate the day. We felt that this was perhaps our most successful egg hunt yet and that is a credit to our wonderful volunteers! Whether you donated candy, stuffed eggs, donated items for a basket, helped man stations at the egg hunt or simply prayed over our time together, we are blessed by your partnership in nurturing the youngest members of the congregation and sharing the love of Christ in tangible ways with the community that surrounds us.



"I'm not done yet"

John 13:12-17; Luke 24:44-49; Philippians 1:3-6

Our theme for May is: So what? What now? We have this vision and mission from God to 'follow Jesus, be one another focused, love as we have been loved, and testify to what He's done," so now what do we do with our commitment? Doug and Kent will converse over our passages in John and Luke as we hold the tension of Jesus telling His disciples, "Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them," after He washed their feet and "stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high" after His resurrection. Sometimes, we feel like we are waiting for the next big thing: job raise or promotion, child, a move, a cure, some miraculous or spiritual 'high' as we encounter God. Happily Ever After!.... (?)


Ruth 4:13-22; Revelations 21:1-7



2023 The Bible Jesus Read by Philip Yancey

In The Bible Jesus Read, award-winning author Philip Yancey combines scholarship and insight to bring new light to old material and stimulates new thought and further study. This eight-session video Bible study uses video and group discussion to explore the sometimes shocking and cryptic writings of the Old Testament to help readers know God better. Yancey serves as guide and interpretive leader of each session and, in a series of in-depth interviews and explanations, he covers five crucial segments of the Old Testament:

At the end of the day, God is less concerned with what we do for Him than who we are in Him. Few figures illustrate that truth better than Jonah. Focused on the prophet rather than his prophecy, the story of Jonah gives us a picture of a man on the run due to his own selfish desires. Instead of showing mercy to his enemies, he determined to keep God's grace to himself rather than share it with those he considered undeserving. Can you relate?

Over the course of 8 verse-by-verse sessions, pastor and author Eric Mason expands our vision to see that Jonah's story is our own. Far more than a thrilling

Sunday school adventure, it offers a profound glimpse into the conflict that occurs when God calls resistant believers to His mission. More importantly, it underscores the depths of His compassion not only in redeeming the lost, but redeeming those He has called to participate in His reconciling work.


