Are we combatting the voices outside and inside the church that do the good work prepared before us? Why do I say all this?

Because I see the church as a heart of blessing, truth and grace. As we are covered in the blood of Christ, made clean, reconciled, forgiven and empowered, we are to go out and declare the Gospel we have received, blessing those around us - i.e., loving others as we have been loved. #### "Man, That Looks Good" Gen 3:1-13

I've heard many arguments in our time that begin with, "Jesus never said anything about \_\_\_\_\_\_." We often use this line of thought when justifying our own desires, right? And thinking on this, was God not with them the whole time? Why not? What about us? This will be part 1 of chapter 3...we will hear the rest of the story next week.



#### Free to Choose


Genesis 3:14-24

After God has given Adam and Eve everything he created for a joyful life and they disobey the one rule that he's given them, they blame each other for what happened and reap the results. God gave them the freedom to choose, but also the consequences of having disobeyed. But throughout the aftermath of their choices, God still loves and cares for them. He cursed the serpent and the ground but not the humans he's made. He made garments for them and clothed them.

As Richard Rohr writes, "God is always sewing garments of love and protection to cover our immense and intense sense of unworthiness. Our very movements toward God are only because God has first moved toward us." One of the most profound quotes I've learned has been attributed to C.S. Lewis: "We are free to choose but we are not free to choose the consequences of our choices." What does this mean for us? What are the implications of this behavioral trait that we seem to relearn over and over again?






