How are you doing today? What are you looking most forward to this week? This month? How are you feeling? In this Advent season, this season of anticipation as we await the arriving Messiah, do you wait for Him? Seek Him? Still hold out hope?

I find this time of year we can get wrapped up in the busy-ness of Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Year's, new sports season, another service, another project, another shopping trip. We plan for family gatherings, gifts, meals to serve, services to plan, trips to execute, tension to work through, meetings to attend, or kids to run to ______. After all the running, serving, attending, cheering, we still have chores (or acts of love to be better named) and work to do. It seems hard to catch a break sometimes.

This time of year, it can be difficult to escape our thoughts and feelings if we recently lost a loved one, tension remains in families, we lost a job or were 'downsized' or 'restructured,' making it difficult to make ends meet let alone have the money for all the planned festivities. We can feel anger, despair, grief, frustration, apathy, anxiety, resentment, or sadness and struggle to *not* crush the joy out of those around us who seem to be so light and full of life.

How about the news? War, murders, abuse, mud-slinging, skewed and slanted language in stories to shed light and shadows on the appropriate players. Reading through the news, it can feel like all is in chaos. *Is this much different than we find in Psalm 46? What shall we do then?*

In the midst of all the chaos named in Psalm 46 (go back and read the whole chapter), we find the unmoving city of God. A city with a flowing stream, whose help comes from within her midst from God Himself. In the midst of present trouble, earth quakes, tidal waves, even wars, the author pens the words of the Lord, "Be still, I know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." In this busy season, in the midst of planning and executing, shopping or grieving, living at peace or in tension, take time to be still to know God. Read Scripture, pray, take a walk in the woods or by a stream. Find a room or closet in your house to isolate and seek the Lord our God. Keep a prayer journal, sing praise songs and hymns to Him. In the midst of this busy season, remember: Advent is a time of anticipation for the arriving Messiah. Be still and draw near Him. As you draw near Him, He will draw near you and all the fullness of this season will be made known to you. Joy. Hope. Peace. Love. But first, be still.

Hope is the Beginning of All Things

Luke 2:22-40

Waiting is hard. It's uncomfortable and often involves suffering of some sort. Anyone who has waited for a situation to resolve, for healing to come, for a grief to pass knows this to be true. God's people were no different. In the opening pages of the gospel of Luke, we enter into a people who were bone weary after God had been silent for 400 years. And yet they had hope, a promise for the future. As God began a new chapter of His story, lives began to be touched, never to be the same. In his kindness, God allowed Simeon and Anna to participate in something they had long hoped for. What can we learn from their stories, from God's people at this time? How does this speak into the hard places and circumstances we find ourselves in 2000 years later?

From the United Nations' press website, "Deputy Secretary-General Amina J.

Mohammed, stating that peace — the United Nations' raison d'être — "is now under grave threat", observed that people's sense of safety and security is at an all-time low in almost every country. Six out of seven worldwide are plagued by feelings of insecurity, the world is facing the highest number of violent conflicts since the Second World War and 2 billion people — a quarter of humanity — live in places affected by such conflict." A quarter of humanity — right now — live in places affected by conflict. The sense of safety and security remains an all time low in the last 80 years. Where do we place our trust and to whom do we seek to receive our peace? How do we seek peace, become peace-makers (which differs from peace keepers), and who is our model? This Sunday, we look delve into the prophet Isaiah's writing and the angels' proclamation "Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace among men with whom He is pleased." Peace among men by the Prince of Peace; could it be so?



Christmas Love Offering


Align Life Ministries




