Jesus following: Jesus, taking a form of a servant, not to be served but to serve, washing His disciples' feet at the time all power and authority had been given Him from the Father. Teaching and living truth, setting people free from sin in order to live an abundant life with Him. As His followers, we assess all our decisions, views, and actions against His life, teaching, and work found in the New Testament Scripture.

One another focused: We not only look to our own interest, but the interests of others: Joining together in corporate worship, meeting together through small groups and Bible fellowships — online when not in person, taking meals, sending cards, making calls, praying together and over each other, bearing with one another in trials, rejoicing in victories, and praising God as He moves through His body.

Loving as we have been loved: Do you remember when Christ first encountered your life? II "Oh, how He loves us so..." II Followers of Jesus at HCOB remember how Christ first loved us and continues to love us, empowering us to love our God, neighbor, enemy, and self with the same gift we received. We show this not only to brothers and sisters in Christ – no matter their local affiliation – but to family members, neighbors, coworkers, strangers who may not know Jesus or heard His good news.

Testifying to Christ's Work Among Us: We serve a Living and Resurrected Savior, the Cornerstone of the church upon which the whole structure is being fitted together. We, as living stones, declare and share with those around us the transformation, healing and wholeness only Christ can bring. He not only sacrificed and died for us, but now His Spirit empowers His body to continue the work He began: not holding people's sin and faults against them, but reconciling them through His work on the cross and giving us the ministry of reconciliation. We are His ambassadors, authorized representatives as though God makes His appeal through us to call to others: Be reconciled to God through Jesus Christ.

Director of Youth Ministry and Discipleship Update

As you may know, the Search Committee for the Director of Youth Ministry and Discipleship began the process to fill this position eighteen months ago. In April 2023, we pursued a candidate that the committee unanimously agreed upon; however, after prayer and consideration, the candidate withdrew their application. We revamped our advertising and received several applications. After screening the resumes, we conducted another set of interviews with three of the applicants. The committee invited two of the candidates for secondary interviews. One of the candidates, without the knowledge of the youth, was invited to a Sunday evening youth gathering, as a guest speaker. Following this lesson, the committee received feedback from Jason, Lydia, and other members of the youth group. After prayer and a lengthy, discerning, discussion amongst the committee, we did not move forward with this candidate. Realizing that after eighteen months, the needs of the youth may no longer be met by the current job description, the committee agreed to seek advisement from the Leadership Team. Leadership understood the concerns of the committee, and both parties agreed to reevaluate the position and the search process. At this point in time, the search will be put on hold until the new search process and position are established. 
Resetting the Mind

Five Elements Towards Relational Healing in the Church


