And Jesus answered and said to them, "See to it that no one misleads you. For many will come in My name, saying, 'I am the Christ,' and will mislead many. You will be hearing of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not frightened, for *those things* must take place, but *that* is not yet the end. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and in various places there will be famines and earthquakes. But all these things are *merely* the beginning of birth pangs.

"Then they will deliver you to tribulation, and will kill you, and you will be hated by all nations because of My name. At that time many will fall away and will betray one another and hate one another. Many false prophets will arise and will mislead many. Because lawlessness is increased, most people's love will grow cold. But the one who endures to the end, he will be saved. This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all the nations, and then the end will come. **MATTHEW 24:4-14**

I find myself considering and pondering this passage in our season of Lent. We live in one of the greatest times of human history: we have food and resources in excess (we know this by how much is wasted), we have access to news and communication from around the world, we can travel to most parts of the world with relative ease thanks to planes, trains, and automobiles. In the US, we have enough structures to house everyone (as of 2013, there were [multiple more vacancies](#) to every one homeless person), we can pursue a wealth of education (so long as we have the wealth to do so), and many state-side have never seen war even less considered putting their life on the line for what they believe. We can live 'comfortable' lives where a bad day may come when we cannot connect to Wifi, sign onto social media, or find a good place to eat (or even park). Many miss such blessings as named above, take for granted, or even feel entitled to have them.

On the other hand, I read the passage above - as generations have read before me - and the gravity is not lost on me. We see many false teachers within the local and American church tying ideologies or political leaders to their faith, making impossible to separate the two even as contradictions within that ideology or political leader clash with the teachings of Christ. Russia, Ukraine, Iran, Palestine, Israel, tensions within China, Taiwan, North Korea - and this is just what

we hear about in the news. Betrayed trust in many institutions of higher learning, government, sports, and church. Taking our individual freedoms to an unhealthy if not toxic level where one may demand rights over another's well-being. Is lawlessness on the rise? Did you break God's law today? Do we see love growing cold or being replaced by hatred, partisanism, racism (or reverse racism if such a thing exists), entitlement, or self-absorption? In the political realm, many vote on one or two topics and/or along party-lines without consideration to who they are voting into office. Within church denominations, some are working their way into positions of authority to exert their ideology on others, not allowing conversation or considering where their teaching may stray from Christ.

In some way, I think each generation must wrestle with this passage, both in its historical and modern contexts. Jesus exhorts, "But the one who *endures* to the end, he will be saved." He's telling his disciples, "Maintain focus; do not be afraid. These things must come."

Where do you place your trust? Do you follow Jesus or another? If you had to decide between Jesus and your nation, Jesus and your job, Jesus and your political party, Jesus and your denomination, Jesus and your family, who would you choose? Only one can set you free. Only one gave all that you may live. Only One of these holds all things together. Maintain focus. Choose wisely.

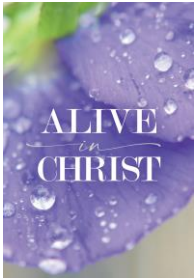
What Do You Seek?

Ps 19; 1 Corinthians 1:18-25; John 2:13-22

In Jesus's time, Jews asked for signs, the Greek sought wisdom. Today does not feel that much different: people seek powerful signs of God or knowledge through science and study to try to define meaning or purpose. What do you seek? A post I've seen many times says something to the effect, "If Paul saw the American church, we would receive a letter." I understand the post...thing is, we already have 13 of his letters, 4 Gospels, as well as the rest of the New (and Old) testaments...maybe we should just read them? Paul says that the cross is foolishness to those who don't believe, but the power to save for those who do believe. Why would it be foolish? And powerful? What would happen in your life, the life of our church, the life of our communities if we held to the promises found in Scripture and lived them out? Let us seek together.

It's So Obvious...

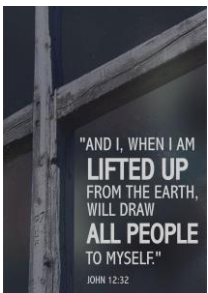
Numbers 21:4-9; Psalm 107:1-3, 17-22; Ephesians 2:1-10; John 3:14-21

The Israelites "grew impatient" and complained about God and Moses. David tells us that "some [people] became fools through their rebellious ways and suffered "illness because of their actions. Paul tells the new believers in Ephesus that "you were dead in your transgressions and sins" ... "when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air..."

Each time, God punished the people but gave them a way out of their misery, with one condition. They had to recognize they were wrong and ask for help. But why would God do this? Repeatedly? John tells of Jesus' meeting with Nicodemus, a Pharisee and member of the Sanhedrin, who is supposed to be an expert in the religious law and gives the answer that we have to remember – even today

Greeks come to Jesus's disciples seeking to follow Him. Not knowing what to do, the disciples go to Jesus and Jesus begins to lay down what's about to happen. 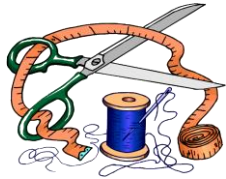

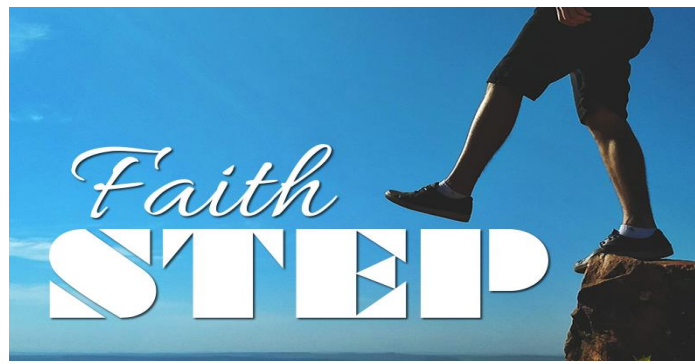

Has God prompted you to do something outside your comfort zone? Did God bless you in an unexpected way? Have you witnessed God's hand in something. Would you share your experience so others can be blessed?

Send your submissions to the church office to include them each month. Let's encourage others by sharing our steps of faith.

As many old-timers in the church know, I taught Sunday school for almost 30 years. Then, at age 60, I had a stroke that affected my voice. I never lost faith in God because he just saved my life after a three day coma. However, the way I could use my faith was turned upside down. I felt helpless because I could no longer share God's word effectively. I then remembered hearing that when God closes one door, he opens another. I prayed God would show me his plan. I soon realized that I could share the written word, so I self-published two books to see if that was God's plan. I eventually realized books are the way of the past, unless one is famous or is willing to spend a lot of money promoting a book. Also, Bible study books are not at the top of the popularity list. Then, I felt God was showing me a way to reach hundreds or thousands of people worldwide; the internet and social media were my way to evangelize!

For the past few years, I have a website, haasbiblepower.com that had about 600 people from all over the world visit it during this past year. (I have my name in the group for copyright reasons.) 600 people per year is not a lot by internet standards, but I spend no money on advertisements or promotion (other than a few business cards).

However, in addition to my website, I have three religious Facebook groups with a combined membership of 889 and hundreds of visitors and followers. My original Facebook group is Haas Bible Power, which covers many subjects not usually covered in sermons. My second group is Bible Power and the Catholic Trinity Doctrine. This group presents the Biblical explores the nature of God and the official Catholic Trinity Doctrine as explained fully in the Athanasian Creed, the Catechism, and the Shield of the Trinity. My third group is Bible Power and Koran. Having read and studied the Koran, talked to missionaries, studied Islam, and attended a mosque, I am well prepared to evangelize to Muslims on Facebook. My ministry in this group is to teach Muslims about Christianity and to expose Christians to the true Islam that is predicted to surpass Christianity as the world's leading religion by 2050. In addition, I am currently an active member of 7 Facebook religious debate groups, reaching thousands of people.

I thank God for giving me the faith to move from adversity to evangelizing the word of God to thousands of people worldwide. I have always said to God, if I only meet one person in heaven who says I helped him/her get there, I will be joyful. **A final thought - if each Christian could convert only one non believer that would be about 2.2 Billion people.**

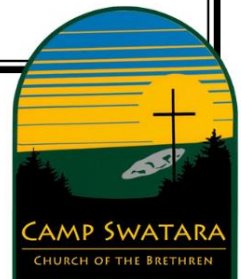

Motivated by Christian faith, COBYS Family Services provides foster care, adoption, counseling, family life education and permanency services for children and families at risk in Lancaster County and the surrounding area.

COBYS facilitates programs and services through The Lancaster County Children and Youth Social Service Agency and the Statewide Adoption and Permanency Network (SWAN). Additional services to support those in the foster care and adoption system and those in need of counseling are provided.

Founded in 1979, COBYS is affiliated with the Atlantic Northeast District of the Church of the Brethren. Since 1989 COBYS has been headquartered in the historic Oregon Mill, north of Lancaster (near Oregon Dairy and Reflections Restaurant). COBYS Family Services continues to represent and provide Christlike concern and care for children and families in need.

2024 Church World Service Ministry Update

Greetings. Last year Hempfield COB added refugee support to our giving ministries, coordinated by Church World Service (CWS).

A January delivery to the CWS warehouse included 13 twin sized blankets created by the ladies sewing group, a set of dishes, various kitchen items, and a coffee maker. These deliveries are made when sufficient donations accrue.

Donations to CWS serve to assist refugees and immigrants who are relocated to Lancaster County and supported by CWS. Immediate services include providing housing, food, and clothing; placement in ESL (English as a Second Language) and cultural orientation classes; facilitating medical appointments; enrollment of children in school; and assistance to obtain social security cards, and similar registrations. Longer term services include budget reviews, work readiness support, continued ESL training, and limited financial support. HCOB supports the ministry by donating needed goods to CWS for distribution as needed to client refugees. Requested goods include **gift Cards to local merchants including transportation, kitchen needs, clothes – particularly warm winter clothes, hygiene goods (toothpaste, body lotion, brush or comb, shampoo, conditioner, towels, washcloths, soap, deodorant, toothbrush)**

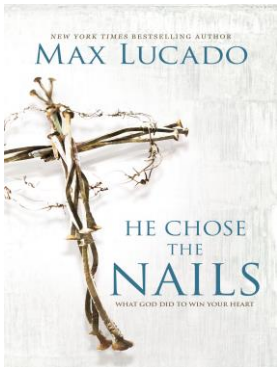

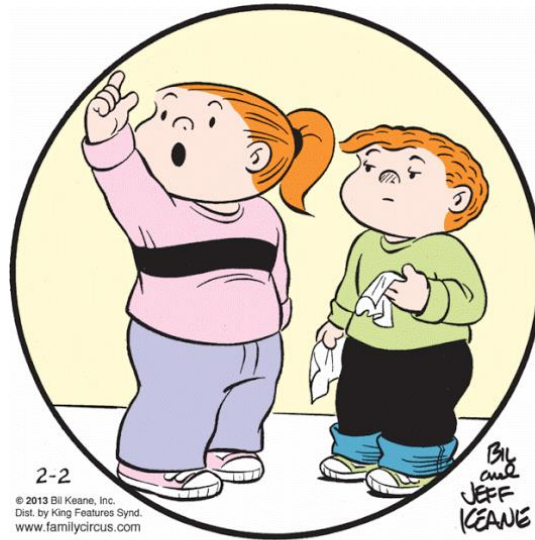
