

Fall Preaching Theme: Follow Me

“Again the next day John was standing with two of his disciples, and he looked at Jesus as He walked, and said, “Behold, the Lamb of God!” The two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus. And Jesus turned and saw them following, and said to them, “What do you seek?” They said to Him, “Rabbi (which translated means Teacher), where are You staying?” He said to them, “Come, and you will see.” So they came and saw where He was staying; and they stayed with Him that day, for it was about the tenth hour. One of the two who heard John *speak* and followed Him, was Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother. He found first his own brother Simon and said to him, “We have found the Messiah” (which translated means Christ). He brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, “You are Simon the son of John; you shall be called Cephas” (which is translated Peter).”

John 1:35-42

“Follow me” sounds very Biblical, old-fashioned, out of date. We don’t live in the first century Middle East, nor are we Jewish teachers or rabbis, so this phrase seems kind of silly. Or maybe intimidating because if you are like me, you know you’re faults and don’t want people to follow *that* side of you. But how do we say “follow me” today? “You want to go to a concert?”

“I got an extra ticket to the musical. Do you want to join me?”

“I’m wrestling in the tournament this weekend; you should come and watch.”

“I have the perfect fishing spot to show you. I’ll pick you up Saturday at 7am.”

“Do you want to learn to quilt. Let me show you.”

We all ask people to follow us in one way, shape or form on a regular basis. We do this when we want to teach a skill, share an experience, or enjoy one another’s company over an activity.

Does this translate to our faith? How do you speak to a co-worker, classmate, or relative about your faith? What about a total stranger? For many of us, the decision to follow Christ informs many (if not every) aspects of our life and yet numerous believers struggle to share or show their faith (as we heard from James earlier this summer). So, what can we learn from the passage above?

- 1) Solid leaders often point to Christ over themselves. We see John the Baptist do this in verse 35 and then two of his disciples roll out.

How do you think John’s other disciples felt about these two leaving? What did they say? Did it matter?

- 2) The two did not directly answer Jesus’s question, but asked where he was staying. HE was what they sought. A commitment to Christ far exceeds anything we can say.
- 3) Andrew, a man of conviction, then told his brother, Simon Peter. When we are excited about something, we want to tell others about it; Andrew started with family.
- 4) John, a Jewish follower of Christ, translates words for his readers (mostly Gentiles) so that they understood the concept and gravity of these actions and the people involved. Followers of the Eternal King do not let superficial barriers like culture or language get in the way of proclaiming the gospel!

As we explore Jesus’s call to “Follow Me” this fall, pray that you may re-imagine what this may sound like today. Pray that doors may be open, we may be confident in the hope we carry, and that we may participate in the reconciliation that Christ calls us to seek. Let us all heed Christ’s call to “Follow Me.”

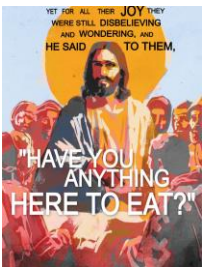
For the Glory of God and Our Neighbor’s Good

Matthew 4:18-22, Acts 2:22-36, 43-47

Today, we kick off both our theme for the fall, Jesus’s call to “Follow Me” and our 50th anniversary as Hempfield Church of the Brethren. For the month of September we ask the question, “Why follow Jesus?” Today, we look into Peter’s first sermon in Acts on the day of Pentecost, especially as it ties to our overarching anniversary theme, For the Glory of God and our Neighbor’s Good. What led to Peter’s sermon? How does the crowd’s perception and reaction shift before and after Peter’s message? What are the results? Did Peter balk at the task for which he was called or did he recognize the truth of Christ, the gravity of His word, and the hope to come? The same one who called Peter to “Follow Me and I will make you a fisher of men,” still calls us today. Why do you follow Jesus? Do you trust that what and who He’s called you to, who He’s called you to be in Him, will come to pass? Let’s get this ball rolling and live into Jesus’s words of “Follow Me!”

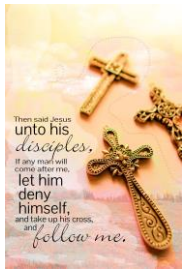
Follow Me.....and Let’s Eat!

Matthew 9:9-17

Jesus calls Matthew...the Roman-government supporting, fellow man extorting, dung of the earth tax collector. How can such a man follow Jesus? And then what’s worse, Jesus goes to Matthew’s house to eat with all his buddies, other tax collectors and sinners (we assume of the worst kind, especially from the religious leaders’ perspective). Jesus told Matthew to follow him...but then followed Matthew to his house. When we follow Jesus, will He follow us around too? Or, did Matthew you want to introduce the Man to those he knew, those now closest with him, so that they may experience what only Jesus had to offer? To whom do we relate in the story? The one called to follow, one of the crowd at the meal, or the religious leaders of the day? Are there people in our society so repugnant that we would not even think of them following Jesus? Are we there just for the celebration? Or, do we want to introduce as many as we’re able to Jesus that some may be saved? Jesus said, “Follow Me” and entered into Matthew’s life. Who will be next?

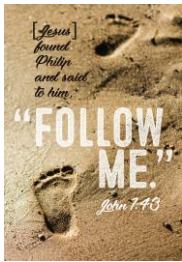
Deny Yourself

Mark 8:34-9:1 (8:1-13)

As Jesus began his earthly ministry, he became a compelling witness for the kingdom of God. Not only did Jesus model what it looked like to follow God, but he also modeled what God's kingdom and people would look like. Spoiler alert: following God required sacrifice. Indeed, Jesus was plain... "if you want to be my disciples", He said, "you have to deny yourself, pick up your cross, and follow me." That preaches well but it's incredibly hard teaching. If following Jesus is such a hardship, why would anyone want to follow him in the first place. We will explore this together.

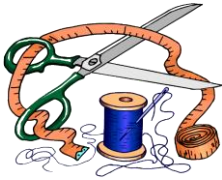

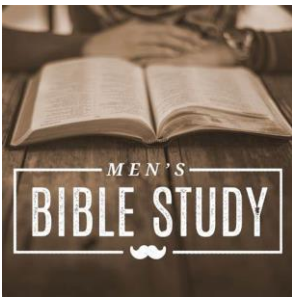
The Quilting and Sewing ministries at Hempfield COB

The days of making baby clothing are far gone, but Hempfield continues to have a wonderful comfoter ministry, and our quilters support the Brethren Disaster Relief Auction.

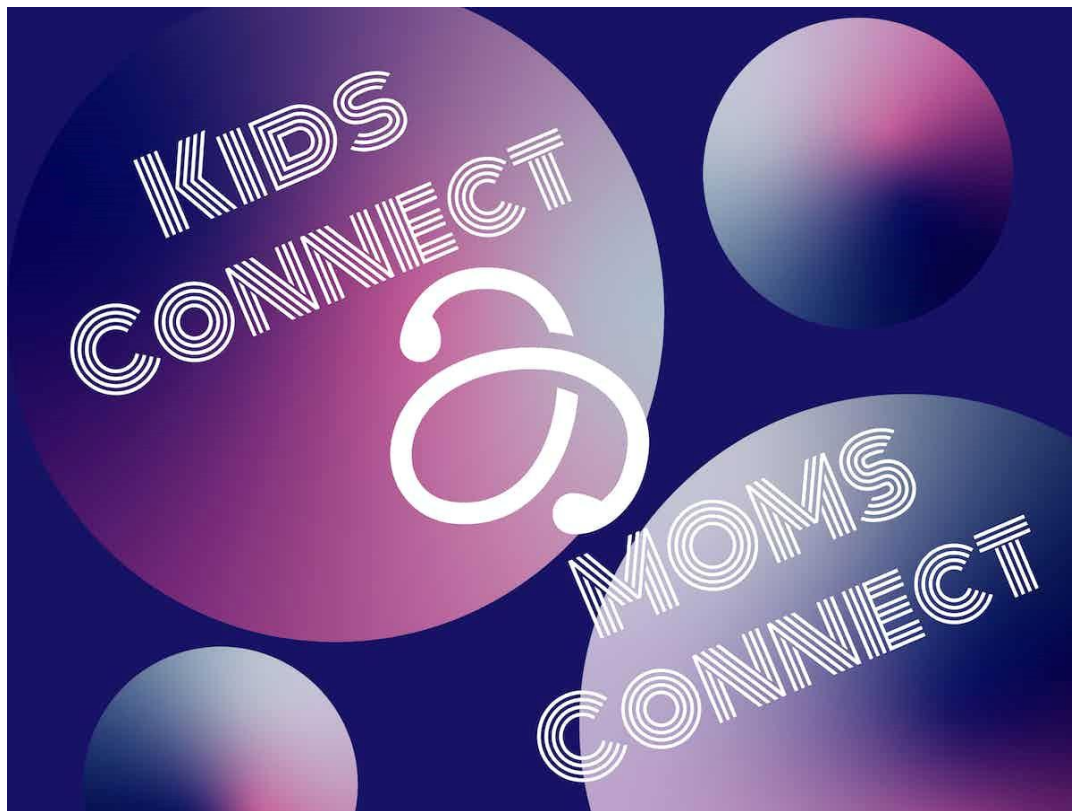

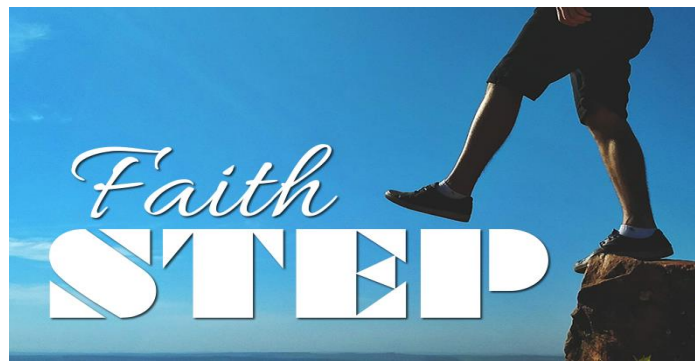

TNT in the Community

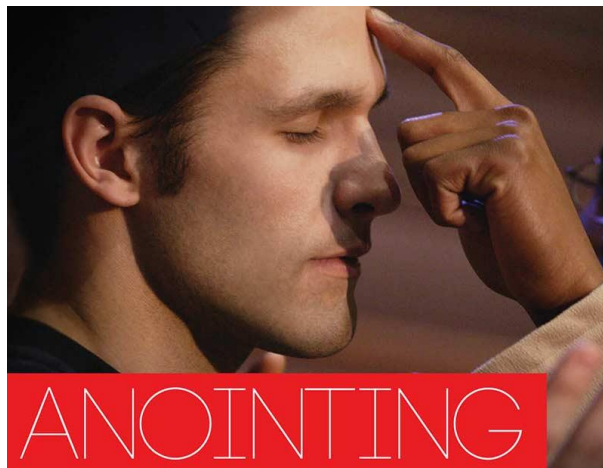

All TNT youth centers are hosted in local church buildings as it is our desire for youth to not only have an encounter with Jesus but to also see the importance of being a part of a church family. Why Do We Anoint?

We anoint one another by gathering with people who are ill, hurting, struggling with decisions or beginning a new phase of life. Our presence, together with the oil and prayers, represents the healing and comfort of Jesus. By anointing one another we trust that God hears our prayers and works for the good of the one we lift in prayer.

Anoint means “to set apart, to authorize and equip for a task of spiritual importance.” Jesus Christ was set apart by the work of the Holy Spirit for his ministry of preaching, healing and deliverance. The Holy Spirit sets believers apart for their ministry in Jesus’ name.

Healing: The practice of anointing is an ordinance within the Church of the Brethren, and includes the pastor laying on hands for physical, emotional, and spiritual healing. The pastor anoints the person’s forehead with oil three times to symbolize:

Forgiveness of sin- strengthening their faith; and, healing of their body, mind, and spirit.

The Laying on of Hands: Others participating in the anointing service will place their hands on the head or shoulders of the person being anointed. This act represents the gift of the Spirit which is the common property of God’s people. Those who lay on hands are the agents of God and represents the bestowing of God’s love, blessing, and power.

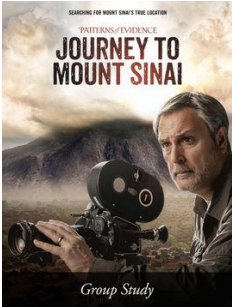


BIBLE CLASSES FOR CHILDREN DURING THEIR PUBLIC SCHOOL DAY

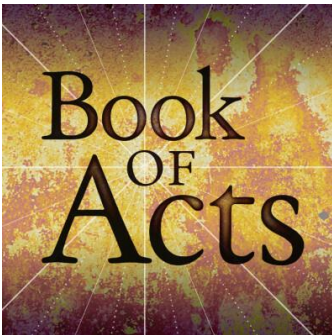


Patterns of Evidence: Journey to Mt. Sinai 1

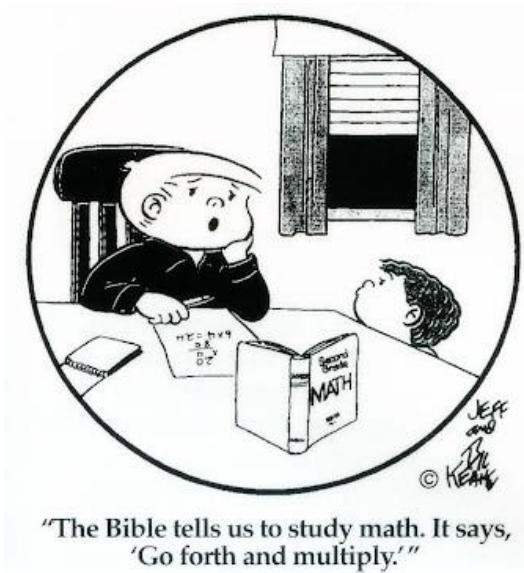
