# Participate in the Plan

2 Corinthians 5.17-19: Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation.

The piece below was written for the December 2014 Herald, my second ever piece submitted for our church newsletter. What is similar from then until now? How have we grown? How have things changed or remained the same? We face much change and uncertainty, growth and hope as we move forward. What I said then, I'll highlight here, "*I am encouraged that we can do all that is needed as Jesus calls us forward. How is He calling you to participate*?" Why repeat this? It still holds true. Your brother in Christ, Pastor Doug.

### From December 2014:

I spent the past weekend in DC with our youth, youth advisors, and the Lititz COB youth. We helped pack up over five hundred lunches and Thanksgiving dinners as well as hand out clothes and blankets to those who otherwise did not have. We spent time together, prayed together, worked together, and participated in a three-hour church service led by our brothers and sisters at St Stephen Baptist Church. The warm welcome we receivedhugs from men and women we just met-allowed the youth to feel at home in a place they may otherwise never experience. While the news shows us the turmoil and racial tensions found in Ferguson, we worked alongside our brothers and sisters-black, tan, brown, fair-skinned to meet those in need. In Jesus Christ, there is no Jew nor Greek, no white nor black, no Republican nor Democrat-all are one in Jesus Christ our Lord. If we are to continue the ministry of reconciliation, we must put Christ's priorities ahead of our own, consider others greater than ourselves, face and sacrifice our own pride and shame for the greater good of the Kingdom. As we make peace with our brothers and sisters created in the image of God, we tear down the walls the enemy wants in place. What can you do to further

this plan of reconciliation, to further the Kingdom of God begun by Jesus? What can we as Hempfield COB do? How can we sharpen and encourage one another? Looking ahead, I pray we move forward as a unified, well-trained, Holy Spirit-filled body that continues to welcome and love those around us and meet the needs of those who lack. As I have started meeting with those in our body, I am encouraged that we can do all that is needed as Jesus calls us forward. How is He calling you to participate?

### For the youth page:

In past two months, we have accomplished a great deal of work and service. We raised over \$3,000 dollars at the Eastland Alpaca Open house over two weekends. We participated in feeding those in need with St Stephen Baptist Church in DC. We had a great time at the Jr High District Retreat at Camp Swatara. And we are ending the month of November with an event called Fully Alive not just existing at Lititz COB with Lititz and Lancaster youth. We've begun to rearrange the youth room and hold cell group there on Monday nights. As of now, no major events are planned for December. Enjoy time with family, play in the snow, and find some rest – you guys are doing awesome!!



Psalm 23:1; Matthew 1:18-25

For the season of Advent, we look to the arrival of the Good Shepherd, weaving Psalm 23 together with the Advent narratives of Matthew and Luke. Traveling to Bethlehem for the first census, Mary (far along in her pregnancy) and Joseph make their way back to his family's hometown. After arriving, she gives birth to Jesus and lays Him in a manger. There was a time when Jesus fully relied on His earthly parents. No matter what would come, Mary and Joseph sought to provide for and nurture Him so that in His human form, He felt safe and cared for. If we can understand this in an human way, how much more does God care for us? How can we recognize His provision for us? How much more so if Christ is who He said He was?


# **Anointing & Provision Among Enemies**



# DID YOU KNOW?

It is our desire to keep you each informed of all the things that you need to know about The Hempfield Church of the Brethren. Below are some things that are always available to you and how to access them quickly and easily. If you have other questions, please feel free to ask. We want you all in the KNOW.



Are you familiar with RightNow Media? It is a wonderful resource for Bible Studies and other materials. The church has a membership for their site and you can have access to it as well. If you'd like the information of how you can access all of this information, see Pastor Doug for login information.



Breeze is our online church management database. You can (and should) have your own login to the system that will allow you to have access to contact information for our church community and to keep your own information active and current. To create your own account, simply visit the church website at <u>www.hempfieldcob.org</u> and click on the Member's Directory link at the top of the page. If you already have an account and password, you can log in from

there. At the bottom of that screen you'll see a place to "create an account". Follow that link to set yourself up - easy as that!. Once your account is created, you will see several tabs across the top of the page - go to the one that says "my profile". That will show you want is already loaded into Breeze for you and will give you the place to edit any incorrect information. In addition, if you'd like to have ready access to Breeze from your smart phone, simply go to the App Store on your phone and download the Breeze app. You will then be able to log into information at your fingertips. If you have questions, contact Irene in the church office.



**www.hempfieldcob.org** is the address for our church website. If you haven't visited there lately, you really should! There is a lot of great information to be found there.

- On the front page you will see scrolling pictures of different upcoming events and other fun times in the life of the church.
- You can follow the tabs on the top of the page to all of our social media platforms where things are posted regularly.
- There is basic information about our church.
- The "Events" tab will lead you directly to the church calendar so you can know many of the meetings and events happening in the life of the church. If you have church-wide events that you'd like added to the calendar, contact Irene in the church office.
- The center of the main page gives the church's vision statement and the pane to the left will give you the title of the upcoming service and a place to access the past services.
- If you click on "Our Church" you can find all kids of information about our ministries and staff. There is also a link under that tab that says "Sermons". There you will find the YouTube videos of past services. The most recent service is typically posted there early in the week following.
- The "Donate" tab takes you directly to screen to be able to give directly online. The dropdown box will allow you to also designate what fund you want that donation to go to.
- The last tab at the top of the page, "This Sunday" takes you to the information and downloadable version of the bulletin for the upcoming service.
- Near the bottom of the page, there are scrolling boxes that highlight other happenings in the life of HCOB. If you click on any of the boxes it will give you update information and registration links. The Herald box will give you links to the most current and previous two issues of the newsletter.
- Basic directions and contact information can be found at the very bottom of the page.

The website is a wonderful resource for much of the information you need to know about what is happening at HCOB!!


# The Quilting and Sewing ministries at Hempfield COB

The days of making baby clothing are far gone, but Hempfield continues to have a wonderful <u>comforter</u> ministry, and our <u>quilters</u> support the Brethren Disaster Relief Auction.

Any of you who may be available on the <u>second Wednesday mornings of each month</u> are invited to come and join us, beginning at 8:00 AM to 11:00, and put together comforters with us. Mary Ellen McEvoy ALSO is always looking for people to knot the smaller baby comforters at their homes during the month. If you are interested in either of these, please get in touch with Mary Ellen... she is very happy to show you what to do!

\*\*\*\*Show quilts\*\* On all of the other Wednesday mornings, also from 8:00 to 11:00, we have a small but mighty group of ladies who hand quilt. Arlene Slotter creates the vast majority of quilt tops that our group has quilted. Hand quilting is a very slow process, and it is not unusual for our group to take five to six months to complete a queen or king size quilt. I am in charge of the quilting ministry here at Hempfield, and if you would like to learn how to quilt, or if you know how and are interested in joining us, please make sure to contact me.
