Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do, he will do also; and greater works than these he will do; because I go to the Father.

John 14:12

About a month ago, pastors from East Petersburg and HBIC gathered at Hempfield COB with Kurt and Malachi from TNT to pray over our community. At the end of our time together, Pastors Josh and Chad from East Petersburg Mennonite invited me to join them at [Exponential 2025](#) as they had another ticket. The conference took place at First Baptist in Orlando, Florida from March 17-20th. After a two-hour delay and a short drive, we finally arrived at our hotel around 2am ready to sleep and head to pre-conference session on Monday.

The conference theme, "Good, Great, Greater" rooted in the verse from John 14 above, challenged people to shift beyond the stationary silos that can be the American church, to the moving, living, multiplying entity we find since the time of Christ. Before the advent of the printing press, Scripture was read publicly as to own a personal or family Bible would have been a privilege. So, how did the church grow in a time without seminaries, without church buildings or gathering places, without a full New Testament as we know it today? How did believers live out the faith when it was illegal and they faced persecution if openly professing the name of Jesus? What did they rely upon?

Alan Hirsch pointed to lives transformed through continual repentance, Scriptural study – i.e., learning the ways of Christ, and incarnational living. He stated that our faith in the West is primarily passed on through an educational process by the pastor to the flock of the local body, but in the Ancient Near East – the time

of Christ – the disciples walked with Jesus day in and day out for three or so years: eating together, walking together, learning together, serving together. Through the victories and trials, the joys and sorrows, the new steps of faith and the encouragement from those who walked before us, lives sealed in the Spirit enjoyed one another's company. There wasn't a 10-step program or "5 rules to live by," there was a daily walk with Christ and His body to learn and practice His ways together.

Another highlight that came from a couple of the speakers named that churches need to work together.

There is only one body with many parts. If we are to impact our communities, we must first learn work, worship, and serve together. As the lone 'brethren' with our Mennonite brothers and sisters, I felt encouraged by this as I thought of the ways that we seek to work with local bodies, food banks, and the church at large to proclaim and live into Christ's Kingdom. May we continue to follow Jesus, speaking of His encounters with our lives,

planting seeds of faith in those around us, that in due time, the Lord of the harvest may collect in full!


Donate:




Trust > Control

Matthew 4:8-11

In this account of Matthew and the last temptation of Christ, Satan promises to give Jesus the kingdoms of the world if He only bow down to worship him. This brings a couple of questions to mind: What does it mean to worship another in posture, position, and authority? In the weakness of our flesh, is it easier to seek control and impose our will on another than it is to trust God at His word and live out what He commands? Jesus again quotes from Deuteronomy, commanding Satan to leave Him. What discipline do we need to learn from this teaching and account? How did this further reveal Christ's resolve to do His Father's will and how can we follow? Further, what relationship does Scripture carry with the Living and Resurrected Christ?


What Do We Remember?


Tenebrae: Submission & Confession


Listening: The Holy Spirit, Discipline

Luke 24:13-35

He is risen! He is risen, indeed? Wait, what? Can we even imagine or fathom what that must have meant for those first believers in the days – days! – after the crucifixion? Take a walk with me. All these events happened around Jesus – the grand entrance, the flipping of tables, the unjust trial, the release of Barnabas (which means son of the father), Pilate, the thief on the cross, the crowds, the yelling, and finally the death of Jesus of Nazareth – and you’re walking away from the city having a conversation with your friend trying to make sense of it all. While you’re walking and talking, this guy walks up to you and kind of, you know, joins the conversation. He’s asking questions, you’re laying out the events, but then, he starts talking about Scripture and history and sorting through the details. Well, you invite him in for a meal – I mean, what could happen next? There are times in our walk of faith we need mostly to listen, and invite people to join us at a meal, and Jesus shows up! He is risen! He is risen indeed!





Any of you who may be available on the second Wednesday mornings of each month are invited to come and join us, beginning at 8:00 AM to 11:00, and put together comforters with us. 




Are you familiar with RightNow Media? It is a wonderful resource for Bible Studies and other materials. The church has a membership for their site and you can have access to it as well. If you'd like the information of how you can access all of this information, see Pastor Doug for login information.



Tithe.ly

Tithe.ly (formerly Breeze) is our online church management database. You can (and should) have your own login to the system that will allow you to have access to contact information for our church community and to keep your own information active and current. To create your own account, simply visit the church website at www.hempfieldcob.org and click on the Member's Directory link at the top of the page. If you already have an account and password, you can log in from there. At the bottom of that screen you'll see a place to "create an account". Follow that link to set yourself up – easy as that!. Once your account is created, you will see several tabs across the top of the page – go to the one that says "my profile". That will show you what is already loaded into Breeze for you and will give you the place to edit any incorrect information. In addition, if you'd like to have ready access to Tithe.ly from your smart phone, simply go to the App Store on your phone and download the Tythe.ly app and download the church app.. You will then be able to log into information at your fingertips. If you have questions, contact Irene in the church office.

NOTE: If you are using Breeze to send out a mass email to the congregation, please use the "Directory" tag that you'll find in the system. The "HCOB Family" tag no longer exists. Thank you!



www.hempfieldcob.org is the address for our church website. If you haven't visited there lately, you really should! There is a lot of great information to be found there.

- On the front page you will see scrolling pictures of different upcoming events and other fun times in the life of the church.
- You can follow the tabs on the top of the page to all of our social media platforms where things are posted regularly.
- There is basic information about our church.
- The "Events" tab will lead you directly to the church calendar so you can know many of the meetings and events happening in the life of the church. If you have church-wide events that you'd like added to the calendar, contact Irene in the church office.
- The center of the main page gives the church's vision statement and the pane to the left will give you the title of the upcoming service and a place to access the past services.
- If you click on "Our Church" you can find all kinds of information about our ministries and staff. There is also a link under that tab that says "Sermons". There you will find the YouTube videos of past services. The most recent service is typically posted there early in the week following.
- The "Donate" tab takes you directly to screen to be able to give directly online. The dropdown box will allow you to also designate what fund you want that donation to go to.
- The last tab at the top of the page, "This Sunday" takes you to the information and downloadable version of the bulletin for the upcoming service.
- Near the bottom of the page, there are scrolling boxes that highlight other happenings in the life of HCOB. If you click on any of the boxes it will give you update information and registration links. The Herald box will give you links to the most current and previous two issues of the newsletter.
- Basic directions and contact information can be found at the very bottom of the page.

The website is a wonderful resource for much of the information you need to know about what is happening at HCOB!!
