

Who's Kingdom do we seek?

What then is Apollos? And what is Paul? Servants through whom you believed, even as the Lord gave *opportunity* to each one. I planted, Apollos watered, but God was causing the growth. So then neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but God who causes the growth. Now he who plants and he who waters are one; but each will receive his own reward according to his own labor. For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, God's building.

1 Corinthians 3:5-9

Our preaching theme and focus this year revolve around the kingdom of God.

- January – Lent: The Kingdom of God is like...parables of Jesus
- Season of Lent: Disciples in the Kingdom
- May – Rally Day: Gifts in the Kingdom
- Rally Day – Advent: Inviting People into the Kingdom

A kingdom-mindset reflects the priority, purpose, and teachings of Jesus Christ through the lives of His ambassadors to see all people reconciled back to God through Christ. It shifts our fears and praise from what *we* can do (or not do) to what *HE* can do through us. If what we do is for our own praise and pats on the back, then that 'glory' will die with us. If, however, we act in faith to follow Him closely, seeking how we might proclaim and live out His kingdom for His glory, then we build on a foundation that lasts.

In the past couple of months, we've witnessed the body of Christ come together to come alongside the community around us and proclaim His Kingdom come. Brothers and sisters from multiple community churches have come alongside families, teachers, and schools to bless them in

times of loss. On May 13th, members from Living Christ Church, Grace Community, Mohler Church of the Brethren, Lancaster Evangelical Free Church, Lancaster Alliance Church, Grace Church at Willow Valley and HCOB brought their gifts and talents together to celebrate the baptism of five young men who decided to follow Jesus. A meal was served, testimonies given, praise by our praise band members, Kurt shared about TNT, I shared about HCOB, and ice cream served at the end of the night. These are just two examples within the last two months. Followers of Christ are volunteering at school events, coaching different sports, and seeking ways to be present in our communities. This points to Kingdom work...

Some plant, some water, some are sent in to break the ground...but it's God that causes the growth, that draws people to Himself through our faithfulness in Christ. Not to build our churches or kingdoms or parties, but to grow His. We are brothers and sisters with fellow Christians in the community. Each with a portion of faith, each with a role to fill, each being used by God. May we continue to allow His Spirit to move and speak through us as we follow Him together.

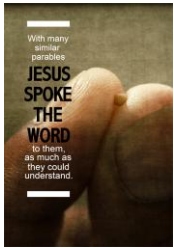
Youth Sunday

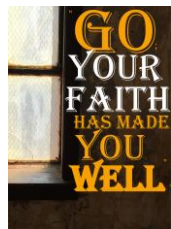
Spiritual Gifts: Faith

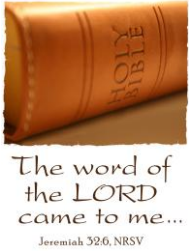
Spiritual Gifts: Apostles & Miracles

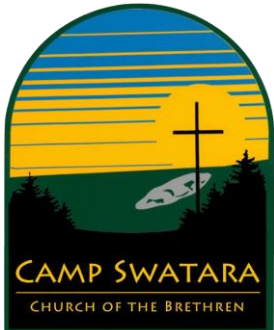


The HOLY SPIRIT continues to work!! The Spirit put the Quilting Ministry on their heart and they responded.

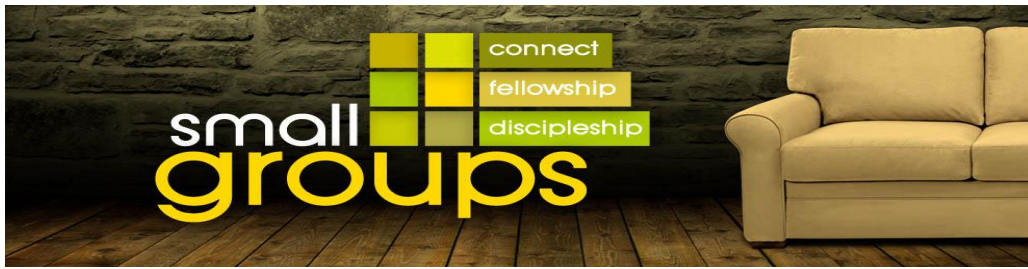

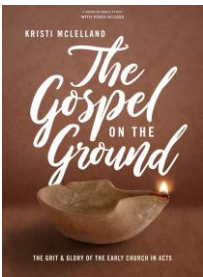


Looking for places to plug in, meet new friends and connect? Watch this space for opportunities to join in the fellowship.

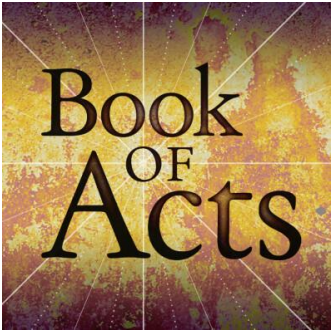

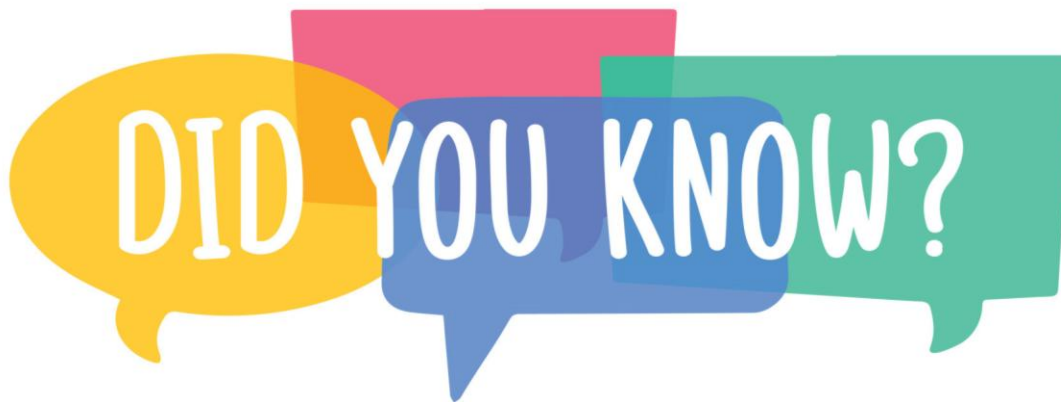

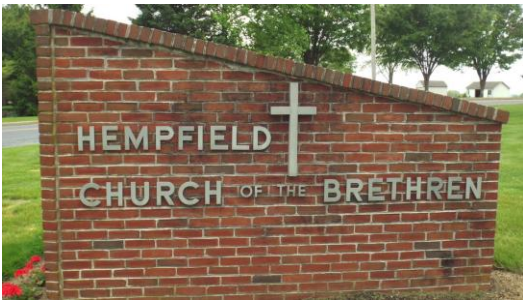
Are you familiar with RightNow Media? It is a wonderful resource for Bible Studies and other materials. The church has a membership for their site and you can have access to it as well. If you'd like the information of how you can access all of this information, see Pastor Doug for login information.



Tithe.ly

Tithe.ly (formerly Breeze) is our online church management database. You can (and should) have your own login to the system that will allow you to have access to contact information for our church community and to keep your own information active and current. To create your own account, simply visit the church website at www.hempfieldcob.org and click on the Member's Directory link at the top of the page. If you already have an account and password, you can log in from there. At the bottom of that screen you'll see a place to "create an account". Follow that link to set yourself up – easy as that!. Once your account is created, you will see several tabs across the top of the page – go to the one that says "my profile". That will show you what is already loaded into Breeze for you and will give you the place to edit any incorrect information. In addition, if you'd like to have ready access to Tithe.ly from your smart phone, simply go to the App Store on your phone and download the Tythe.ly app and download the church app.. You will then be able to log into information at your fingertips. If you have questions, contact Irene in the church office.

NOTE: If you are using Breeze to send out a mass email to the congregation, please use the "Directory" tag that you'll find in the system. The "HCOB Family" tag no longer exists. Thank you!



www.hempfieldcob.org is the address for our church website. If you haven't visited there lately, you really should! There is a lot of great information to be found there.

- On the front page you will see scrolling pictures of different upcoming events and other fun times in the life of the church.
- You can follow the tabs on the top of the page to all of our social media platforms where things are posted regularly.
- There is basic information about our church.
- The "Events" tab will lead you directly to the church calendar so you can know many of the meetings and events happening in the life of the church. If you have church-wide events that you'd like added to the calendar, contact Irene in the church office.
- The center of the main page gives the church's vision statement and the pane to the left will give you the title of the upcoming service and a place to access the past services.
- If you click on "Our Church" you can find all kinds of information about our ministries and staff. There is also a link under that tab that says "Sermons". There you will find the YouTube videos of past services. The most recent service is typically posted there early in the week following.
- The "Donate" tab takes you directly to screen to be able to give directly online. The dropdown box will allow you to also designate what fund you want that donation to go to.
- The last tab at the top of the page, "This Sunday" takes you to the information and downloadable version of the bulletin for the upcoming service.
- Near the bottom of the page, there are scrolling boxes that highlight other happenings in the life of HCOB. If you click on any of the boxes it will give you update information and registration links. The Herald box will give you links to the most current and previous two issues of the newsletter.
- Basic directions and contact information can be found at the very bottom of the page.

The website is a wonderful resource for much of the information you need to know about what is happening at HCOB!!



ARE YOU ON FACEBOOK???

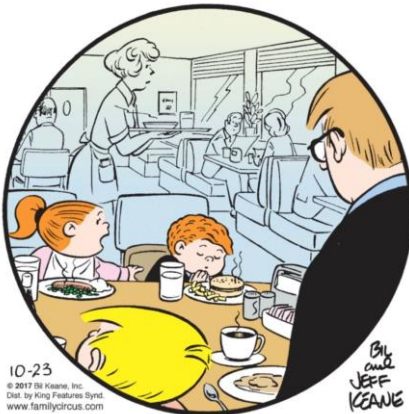
