Recently I found myself preparing to lead Praise Band for the first time in probably a year. Yes, I've spent many years leading worship in this respect, but after a year off, my fingers felt shaky and my mind was racing. What if I forgot how to do this? What if I make a mistake? Who am I to do any of this kingdom work at all?

It's amazing how quickly we can make that leap, isn't it? Who am I to do anything for the kingdom of God? In our desire to serve well, in humility and deference to God's call on our lives, we can so easily disqualify ourselves. We stay frozen in place. We stay small. But God never meant for his people to think of themselves in this way.

Moses was a man who wondered how God might use him after his unfortunate past. I can almost see him looking back over his shoulder when he heard a voice call out to him from a bush that both burned but was not consumed. While he presented himself to the Lord, he also quickly disqualified himself. He was afraid, slow of speech and doubtful anyone would listen to him. We do this too, if we're honest.

Peter was a bit like this too. On one hand, he was bold and brash, quick to speak but on the other hand, he was just like us. Fearful. Uncertain. At times, doubtful. He loved Jesus with his whole heart, but he also had very real responses to what was happening around him. So when Jesus miraculously appeared before the twelve, walking upon the water, Peter boldly asked to join him. Ministry so often starts this way! With excitement and courage. When we are focused on Christ, the burden is easy. But, Peter, just like each of us, started to look around. He saw the waves around him. The wind buffeted his face. He realized the impossibility of what he was doing in that moment.

He took his eyes off Christ and he began to sink.

This season may feel a little bit different than this time last year, well, or maybe not. There was a great deal of change at HCOB as I stepped into this pastoral role and as Monica joined our staff as Children's Ministry Coordinator. Change, it seems, is inevitable. But that doesn't mean change need be negative. In fact, Craig Smith, our former District Executive frames new opportunities this way, "Ordinary obedience can place us on the edge of extraordinary moments." "Faithfulness in everyday assignments," he continues, "often positions us for larger moments of trust." That is good news!

As I leave you, I want to draw to mind one of the questions Pastor Doug framed for the body before he began his sabbatical. Doug said, "God will build His church, His is the good shepherd. I am the under shepherd. How are you growing in him through this time? Where do you see His Spirit moving and through whom?"

I invite you to consider these questions prayerfully and as the Lord reveals more of his heart, share what you are hearing. With a family member, with your friends, but also, I'd be delighted if you'd share what you are discerning with me.

Hello, August!

July presented many of us with adversity and unexpected challenges right from the beginning of the month. To those that started the month with storm destruction or without power, please know we continue to pray over you as you battle storm cleanup or insurance runarounds.

In Children's Church this month, we highlighted some stories from the book of Daniel. We learned that we can worship God no matter where, just as Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego worshiped God in the fiery furnace. We learned that we can be brave for God in the face of differences, and trust that God will continue to provide for us. We also learned what it means to be loyal to God, just as Daniel had been.

Along with the new school year that will begin in late August/early September, we will be diving into a new Children's Church curriculum. This curriculum is titled "Simply Loved." It will guide our children through God's Word using a format similar to Vacation Bible School. We will begin our lessons gathered together to either worship together or meet a new Bible Buddy (an animal character who will reinforce Bible points and memory verses). From there, the classes will split to their respective classrooms and jump into the week's Bible story, Bible point, and Bible memory verse. I am excited to also incorporate a monthly trivia game for our grade school class- they are always up for a little friendly competition!

As the school year will be starting soon, we are beginning to plan a Back to School Blessing for our children and youth. During the worship service on Sunday, August 23rd, we will be calling the children up to the front of the sanctuary to be prayed over. We would like to include the congregation in praying over them before the children begin their school years. Keep an eye out for a way in which you can be involved in this blessing beforehand!

Featured Hymn Writer

August 2026

Bill and Gloria Gaither

There are actually two hymn writers to be honored for the month of August. They are the Gaithers, both Bill and Gloria, who are well known for writing and performing thousands of gospel songs and hymns. Many of their songs have been recorded by other artists, and have become widespread favorites in churches in America and worldwide. A few of their most famous are "Because He Lives", "He Touched Me", "The King is Coming", "Something Beautiful", and "There's Something About That Name".

Gloria and Bill were both high school teachers and both have been recognized as Christian songwriters of the century in 2000. They have also won a total of 8 Grammy Awards.

Bill was born on March 28th, 1936 in Alexandria, Indiana, the son of a farmer. He took music lessons as a child, and later he and his brother and sister formed the Gaither Trio in 1956. In 1981 they started the Gaither Vocal Band. Both have included personnel changes over the years, but continued to entertain across the nation for many years.

Gloria was born on March 4th, (my birthday as well), 1942 (but not the year) in Battle Creek, Michigan to a pastor and his wife. She had a lifelong love of literature, poetry and writing. The two met at Alexandria High School and were married in 1963. They have three children together. Gloria replaced Bill's sister for three decades in the Gaither Trio, till she decided to focus her talents elsewhere in their growing business. She continues to act as narrator and script writer for their Homecoming Series and national magazine which began in 1991. She has also written more than forty books. Many of you have been in the television audience for their inspirational shows over the years, and have been blessed with many of their beautiful old gospel songs and very talented regulars and guests who have shared with all of us us their songs of praise and worship.

Thank you! We are so grateful for your faithful prayers for TNT Youth Ministry. Every time we see God move in the life of a student, we're reminded that none of this happens apart from Him. Thank you for standing with us as we serve young people throughout our communities and the public schools we have the privilege of partnering with.

Summer is always a unique season for TNT. While our schedule looks a little different, ministry certainly doesn't slow down. In fact, we've already seen God at work in incredible ways, and we wanted to share just one story that reminds us why we do what we do.

A Story of God's Faithfulness

A few years ago, a young man named Larry first came to our Hempfield Youth Center for one simple reason—he loved playing basketball.

Like many students, he wasn't looking for church. He wasn't looking for a Bible study. He simply came because there was a place where he felt welcomed.

Over time, relationships began to form. Volunteers invested in him, encouraged him, and invited him to church. Larry accepted that invitation, and little by little, God began transforming his life.

Today, Larry faithfully attends Hempfield Church of the Brethren. He's involved in the youth group, serves in the children's ministry, sings in the choir, and has publicly declared his faith through baptism.

Just a few weeks ago, the church held its annual Youth Sunday. During the service, Larry stood before the congregation and preached the message, sharing from the book of Jonah and boldly proclaiming what God had been teaching him.

What an incredible reminder that God is still changing lives.

This is why TNT exists—not simply to host youth centers, but to introduce students to Jesus, connect them with the local church, and watch God continue the work He begins.

Thank you for praying. Larry's story is one of many, and your prayers are part of what God is using to make stories like his possible.
