THE WORSHIP TEAM invites the congregation to take a close-up look at the items displayed in the baptistry area which represent "Generations of Faith"; specifically, the genealogies of Jesus listed in Matthew and Luke. Two women are highlighted: Ruth was a foreigner in Israel, and harvested both barley and wheat in Boaz's fields, and Rahab was a prostitute who helped Israelite spies escape from Jericho using a rope to lower them from the city wall, and tied a scarlet cord to her window, which identified and protected her household when the Israelite army later stormed the city. David, the shepherd boy who became a king, is alluded to with a shepherd's crook as well as an instrument to hold sheep still as they are being sheared, in addition to the royal fabrics and kingly crown. The carpenter Joseph, Jesus' earthly father, probably used tools very similar to the many different ones displayed.
