

### **Food Pantry Needs**

Hempfield Food Pantry: Canned carrots, canned mixed vegetables, canned peaches, canned pears, canned sweet potatoes, elbow macaroni Manheim Central Food Pantry: baked beans, canned fruit, crackers, soup-vegetable beef & clam chowder, spam, and tissues
