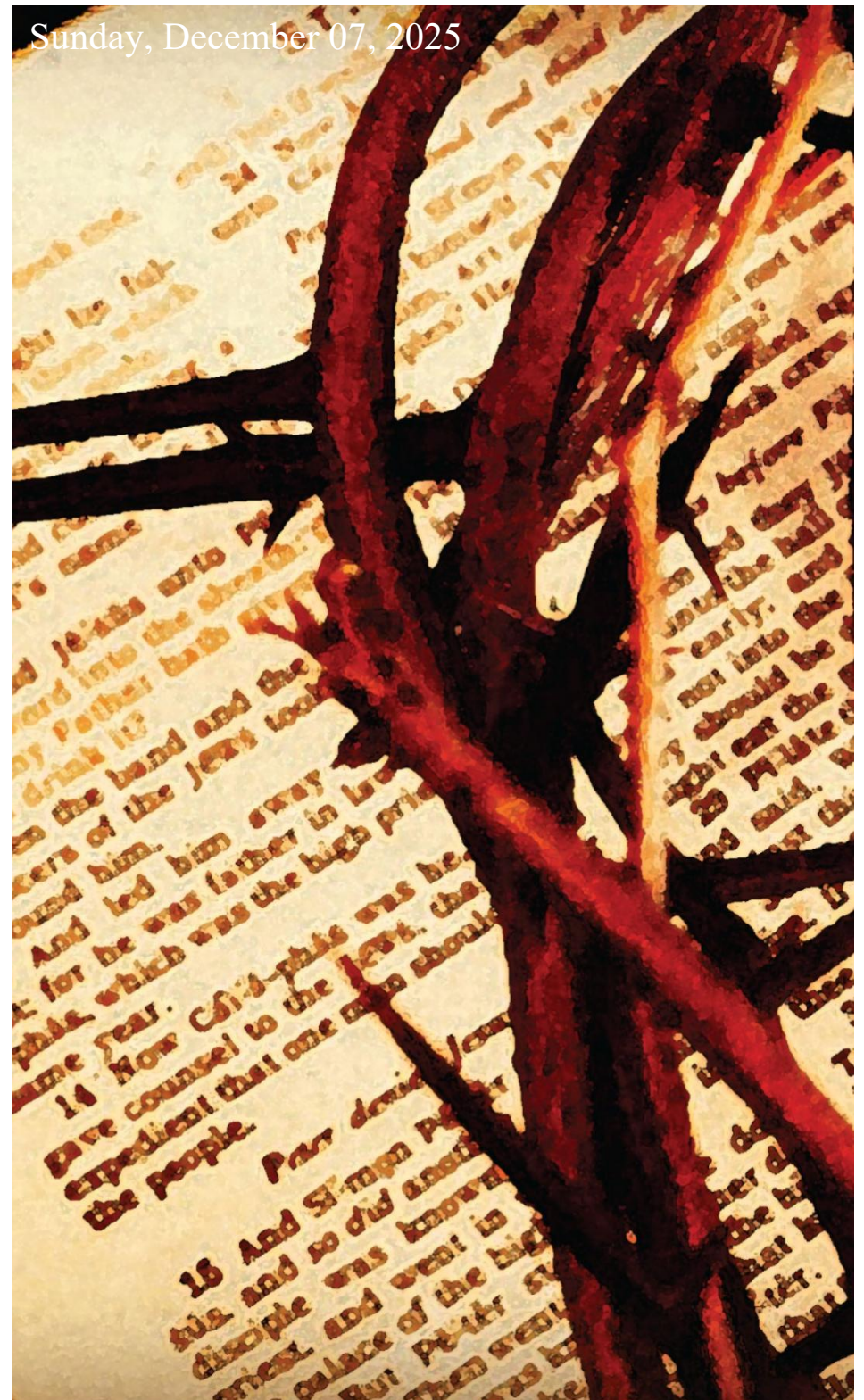

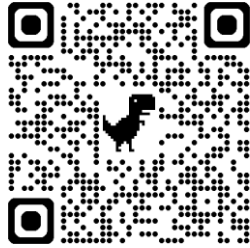

Food Drive Update

Thank you for your participation in our November food drive to support the Hempfield Area and Manheim Central Food Pantries. Not only your personal donations, but also your outreach to

neighbors and friends were evidenced throughout. We had contributors via your Facebook posts, forwarded emails, and word of mouth.

Donations for the two days totaled 1,528 pounds and \$3,860. These donations roughly doubled our poundage for the year and moved our cash donations to over \$11,000. Of the 1,528 pounds donated, 274 pounds were for personal care items, distributed to clients by the Manheim pantry.

December Collections

There is more to be done in our ministry to help combat food insecurity. We became familiar with the Faith Tabernacle Church of God Food Pantry through our Five Elements Prayer Group, inspiring Dave Bendit to become active in its operation. Faith Tabernacle is located at the intersection of Duke and South Ann Streets in Lancaster. While the congregation is predominately black, the neighborhood around the church has changed over the years and the food pantry's clientele is about 90% Hispanic descent.

The source of the food for the Faith Tabernacle Pantry comes from two main sources: CAP – Community Action Partnership & the Central PA Food Bank. During the past year, the availability of free food has dwindled significantly. The church normally gets a small amount of grant money from the State, but this has been delayed due to the budget issues in Harrisburg, so funding is a big issue.

Our donations can help. As a result, **we are committing all our December collections to support the Faith Tabernacle Pantry.** Please place your donations as usual in the closet off the Narthex, in, or around the carts provided. Below is the list of items needed by Faith Tabernacle. Money donations can also be given. Please make checks payable to Hempfield Church of the Brethren with Faith Tabernacle FP in the memo line.

Items needed include: canned meats, canned vegetables, canned fruit, packaged pasta of all types, pasta sauces, boxed mac and cheese, cereal, peanut butter and jelly (no glass containers), one-pound bags of dry beans and rice, canned and boxed soups, pancake mix and syrup.
